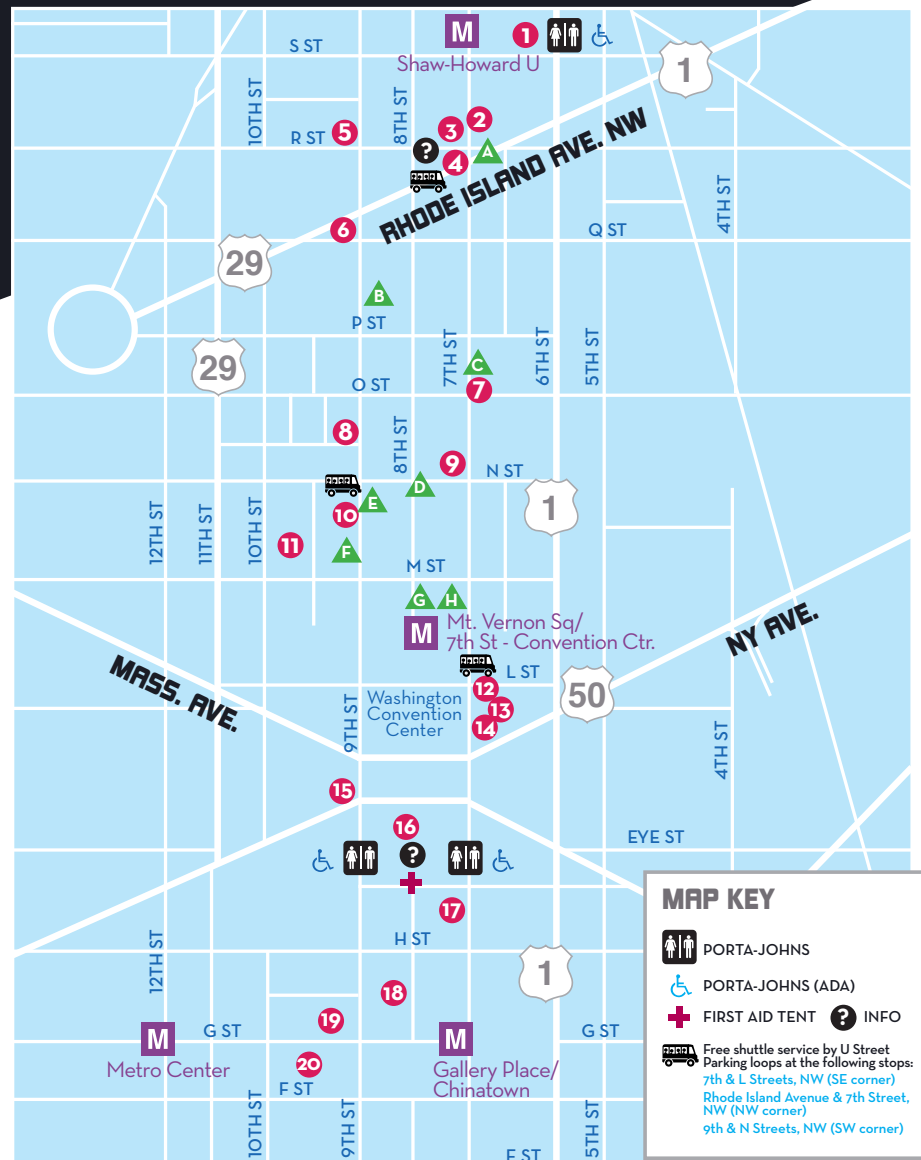


MAP OF VENUES

PUBLIC ART

- A** *Vivace (2010) by Craig Kraft:* This painted aluminum & neon sculpture evokes the spirit of Jazz, for which the Shaw neighborhood is known. In front of the Watha T. Daniel/Shaw Library, 1630 7th St. NW.
- B** *Shaw Community Mural (2009) by Byron Peck & City Arts:* This colorful mural blends local historic figures & architecture with African motifs. North side of 1507 9th St. NW.
- C** *Acrobatic Troupe (1986), mixed media sculpture by Joan Danziger,* in the vestibule of the Kennedy Recreation Center, 1401 7th Street, NW.
- D** *Portraits DC 2009 Winners,* a photographic exhibit on the windows of the Walter E. Washington Convention Center facade on the 700 & 800 blocks of N Street, NW.
- E** *Unintentional Drawing #4, #5 (2010) by Craig Kraft,* in the windows of the Walter E. Washington Convention Center. Southeast corner of 9th & N Streets, NW.
- F** *Shaw Racing Team (2010), a mural by Words Beats & Life,* on the north wall of 1208 9th Street, NW, at the entrance to Blagden Alley.
- G** *Windows on DC,* a series of back-painted windows & window installations on the facades of the Walter E. Washington Convention Center, on the south side of the 700 & 800 blocks of M Street, NW.
- H** *Transit (2007) by Wendy Ross,* an aluminum sculpture hanging above the Mount Vernon Square/7th St—Convention Center Metro station entrance at the southwest corner of 7th & M Streets, NW.
